

# Master of Science in Law: Where Law, Business, and STEM Converge

Northwestern University's Master of Science in Law (MSL) integrates the study of law, regulation, policy, and business into a curriculum for STEM-focused students and professionals. Offered by the Pritzker School of Law, the MSL arms its students with powerful skills and knowledge that allow them to solve multifaceted problems and succeed in today's complex world. MSL graduates go on to become valuable innovators and leaders in their fields. They are prepared for a variety of intersectional roles in business and policy settings and are greatly sought after for what they bring to the table: a holistic approach, the mindset to anticipate challenges and assess risk, and the ability to communicate and interact across disciplines.

The MSL is offered in two formats: residential full-time, which takes place in Chicago over one academic year (August to May), and online part-time, which is designed for working professionals and is completed in 2-4 years.

## Curriculum

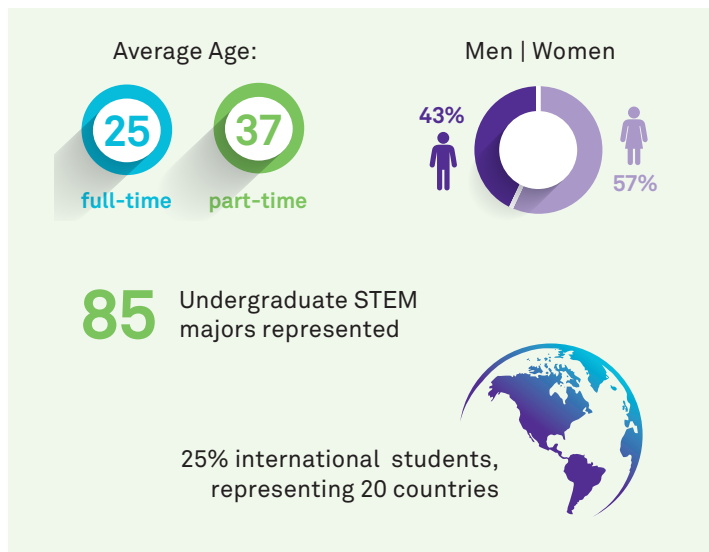
Centering on the intersection of law, business, and technology, the MSL curriculum offers courses in regulatory analysis and strategy, intellectual property and patent design, business and entrepreneurship, and skills development.

- MSL students customize the program to fit their individual needs; most mix and match courses from all areas of the curriculum, while some choose to focus on one particular area.
- Classes are taught by a combination of Northwestern's renowned faculty and an impressive group of industry experts who bring their practical experiences to the classroom.
- Courses focus on real-world challenges and context. Instructors utilize innovative teaching methodologies and active-learning techniques.
- Several times each year, the MSL offers Power Weeks, which are one-week sessions of compressed classes. These classes give students an opportunity to take an array of electives that cover trending topics and specialized skills.

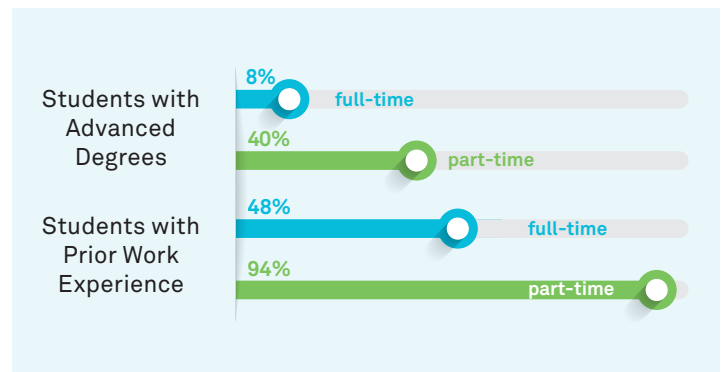
## MSL BY THE NUMBERS

## Law School Community

MSL students benefit greatly from studying at one of the nation's most prestigious law schools. Students have access to world-renowned faculty and a highly successful alumni base, in addition to broader Northwestern University resources.

## Career Development

MSL students benefit from comprehensive professional development support. Dedicated MSL staff meet one-on-one with each student to provide guidance on career options, networking, and job searches. A combination of guest lectures, panels, events, and career fairs help MSL students develop their career goals and job search plans. In addition, MSL students have access to Northwestern University's Career Advancement resources.

## STUDYING IN CHICAGO

Northwestern Pritzker School of Law is located in the heart of downtown Chicago on the shores of Lake Michigan. The third most-populated city in the country, Chicago is home to world-renowned museums, music, and architecture; professional sports; diverse restaurants and night spots; and miles of lakefront parks and beaches.

Chicago is an established center of commerce and government with a thriving entrepreneurship ecosystem, making it an ideal setting for MSL residential study. The city is home to leading pharmaceutical and technology companies; large corporations and law firms; and many successful startup organizations. Two nationally-recognized innovation hubs—1871 and MATTER—are dynamic components of the local scene, as are top-ranked accelerator programs, including Techstars Chicago and Impact Engine.



### MSL FORMATS

#### RESIDENTIAL FULL-TIME

- Duration: *9 months*
- Location: *Chicago campus*
- Start Date: *August*
- Format options: *Residential students can take up to 9 credits in online elective courses.*

#### ONLINE PART-TIME

- Duration: *2–4 years*
- Location: *Online*
- Start Dates: *August and January*
- Format options: *Online students must take 2 credits in residential elective courses in Chicago, and may take as many in-person elective courses as they wish.*

### ADMISSIONS

MSL applicants submit an online application, which includes a statement of interest, a resume or CV, a video interview, a letter of recommendation, and official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions. Standardized test scores are not required, although applicants may submit scores if they choose. There is no fee to apply.

International students must submit a TOEFL or IELTS score (or request a waiver) and complete an English language assessment.

A limited number of merit- and need-based scholarships are available for full-time residential students, including designated scholarships for applicants with PhDs. Most students are eligible for loan packaging to cover the cost of attendance.

Applications are reviewed regularly during the admissions cycle with formal deadlines on February 1, April 1, and June 1.
